MN Legacy Program

In 2023, The Beim Foundation awarded 11 grants totaling \$133,500 under the Education and Human Services guidelines. The Education guidelines focused on programs or projects that provide services to underserved K-12 students by focusing on closing the opportunity gap and addressing needs amplified by the pandemic. The Human Services guidelines focused on mental health programs that provide direct services to historically underserved K-12 youth including, but not limited to, individual services, family services, counseling services, in-school services, and after school programs.
